(insecticide solvent)

Vinylpyridine

Propylene Glycol

(antifreeze!)

Aminobiphenyl

(known human carcinogen)

Naphtalamine

(mothballs)

Aminobiphenyl

Benz(a)anthracene

(causes tumors in mice)

Benzo(A)pyrene

Cholesterol

Butyrolactone

Quinoline

(specimen preservative, extracted from coal tar)

Harman

(a Mutagen & Neurotoxin)

Nitrosornicotine

(a Group 1 carcinogen)

Nitrodiethanolamine

(a contaminant formed in metalworking fluids, pesticides & antifreeze)
